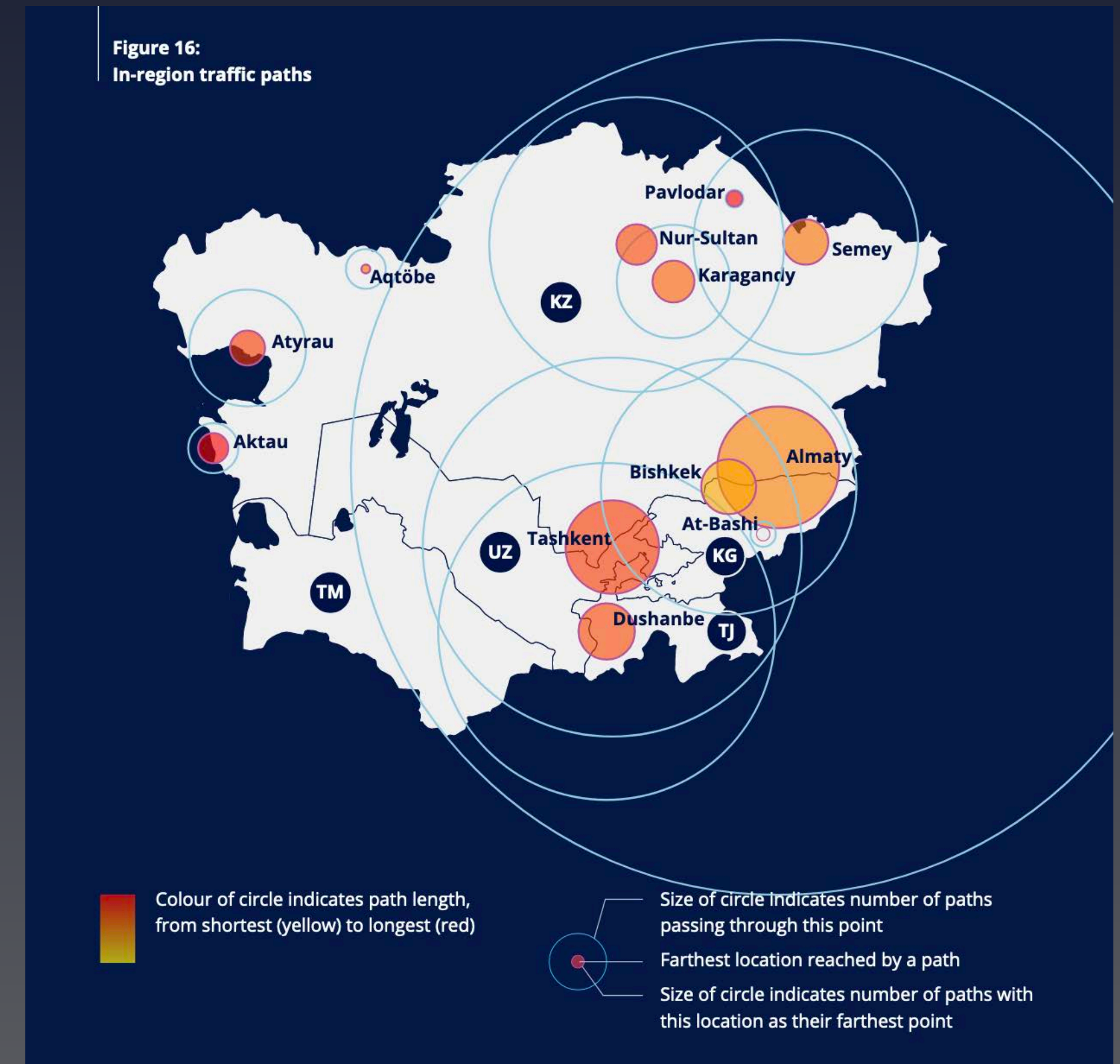

- 2017: dedicated extra resources to engagement activities in the Caucasus and Central Asia
- 2020: published our 'RIPE NCC Internet Country Report: Central Asia' (available in English and Russian)
- 2021: Euro-IX, the Internet Society, and the RIPE NCC organised a series of online events - Virtual Peering Series (VPS-CA)



The Journey on the Silk Road (2)



- 2022:
 - September saw the RIPE NCC Days in Tashkent, Uzbekistan
 - In November we are holding the first in-person Central Asian Peering and Interconnection Forum (CAPIF) in Almaty, Kazakhstan
- We have also worked with the Iranian technical community for years and will continue to do so

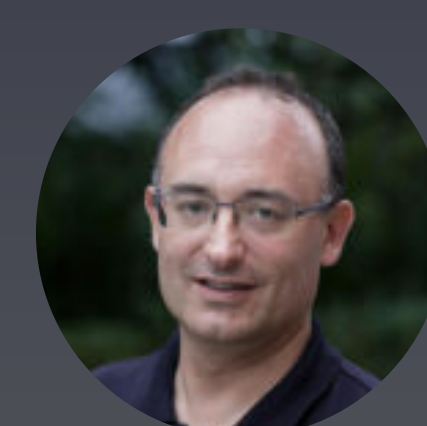

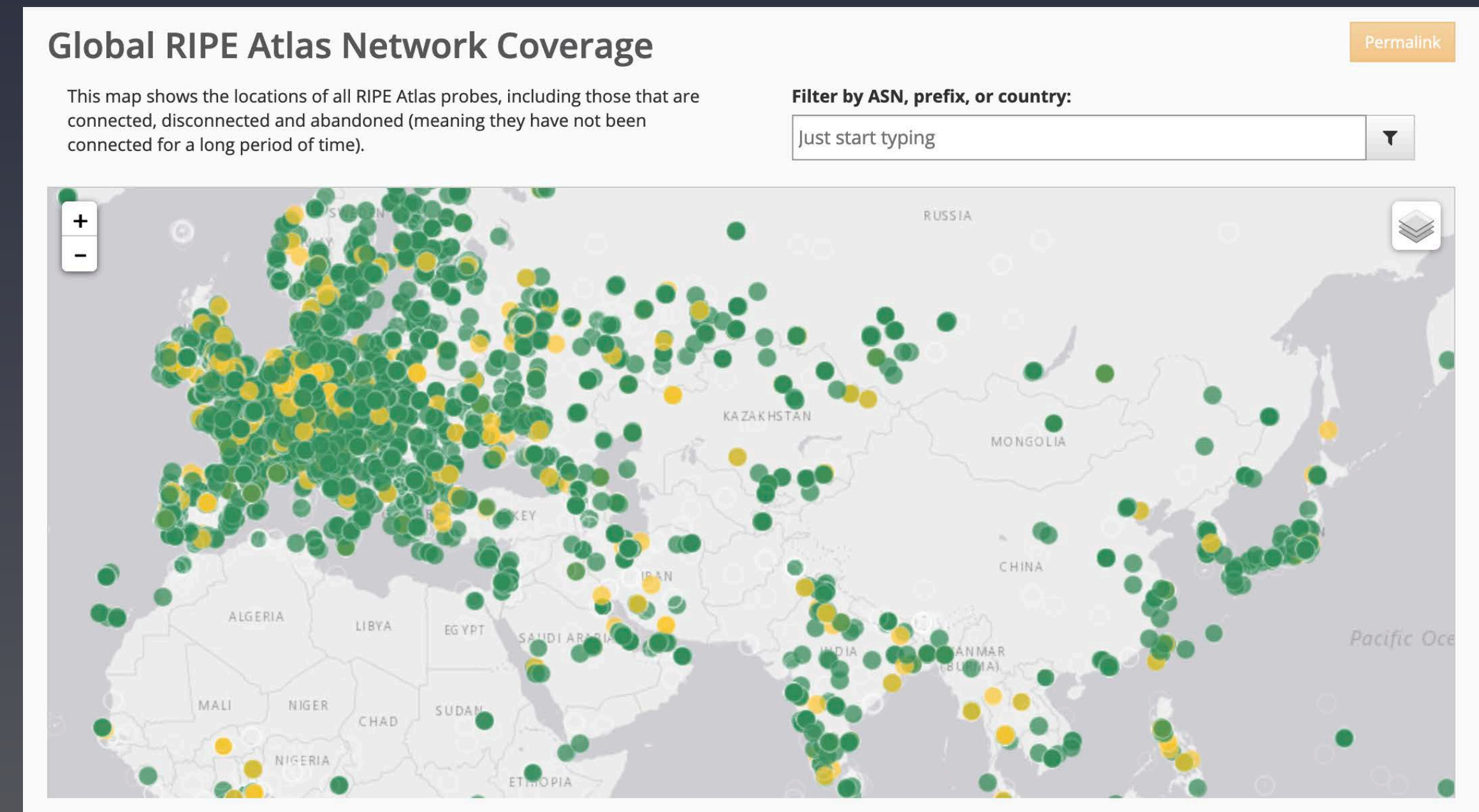

RIPE NCC

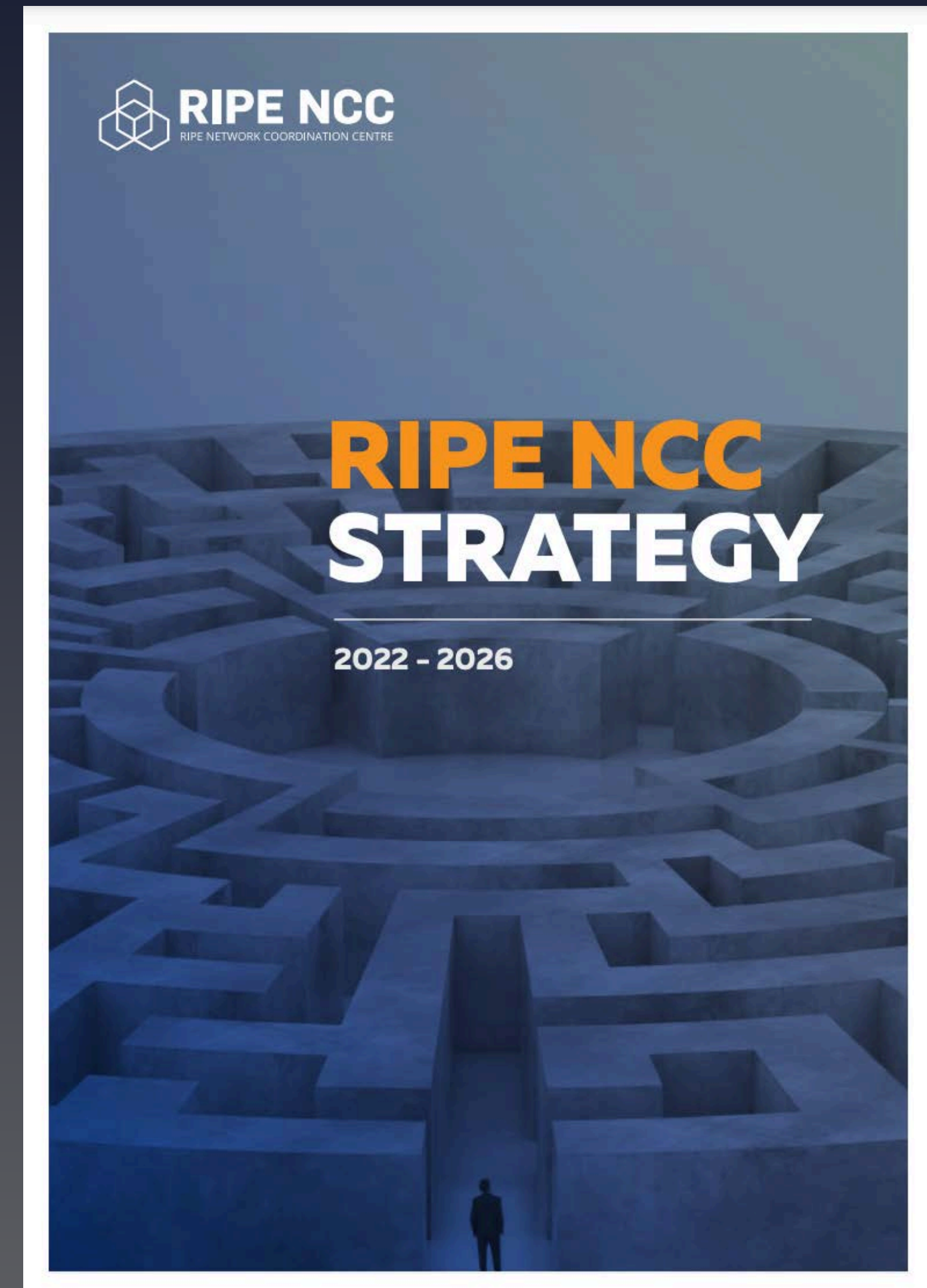


- Formed in 1992
